Refunds

Parent requests for refunds are subject to the discretion of the college and made on a case-by-case basis. Refunds will be provided where the College deems it is reasonable and fair to do so, taking into consideration whether a cost has been incurred, the Department's Parent Payment Policy and Guidance, Financial Help for Families Policy and any other relevant information.

Refunds will only be approved for the following circumstances:

1. The activity or excursion has been cancelled by the college; or
2. The College does not permit a student to participate or attend the activity or excursion due to suspension or behavioural consequence.
3. Serious injury/illness prevents the student from participating in the activity or excursion providing evidence through a medical certificate.
4. The Principal can make a decision based on their discretion if they believe the refund is fair and equitable.

In the event that the college has already paid for the service/item, a pro rata amount may be refunded (e.g. the bus cost is not refunded but the entry cost is refunded).

Refunds will only be processed upon the Parent/Guardian completing a Request for Parent Refund Form.

Refunds will only be made by Direct Deposit.

If an item or excursion is non-refundable this will be specified on the communication that Parents/guardians receive.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
